Usage Summary – Pupil Premium Ever 6

Following consultation with the Sutton Trust teaching and Learning Toolkit, the Pupil premium will be utilised in Bardney CofE & Methodist Primary School in the following ways:

Reducing Class Sizes and small Intervention Groups (incorporating Feedback, Meta-cognition, Early Years Intervention, One-to-one, Phonics – Staffing) (£15,465)

This amount is being used to enable the school to move to a 6 class facility, ensuring that all 30 pupils are in smaller classes throughout the school (26 or under in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1; 24 or under in Key Stage 2). This funding is also being used to provide a Teaching Assistant within each classroom and also smaller Intervention Groups for pupils in each class as required. Smaller classes and higher staffing levels ensure that pupils receive more individual tuition, One to One tuition, individual feedback and Early Years/Phonics Intervention, all of which have been found (by the Sutton Trust-EEF teaching and Learning Toolkit and ourselves) to accelerate learning.

Creation of small Group Working Areas throughout the school (£13,541.67)

This amount has been used to create Group Working areas for each class to enable all 30 pupils to participate in small Intervention Groups (max of 8 pupils per group at any time) with a TA to accelerate learning thereby 'narrowing the gap' with their peers.

IT equipment for the above Group Working Areas (£8,393)

This amount has been used to provide laptops, projectors, white boards, iPads and touch screen monitors for the above small Group Working areas. Availability of these facilities enables all 30 pupils to access the same facilities within their small groups that their peers are using in the classroom environment.

Key Stage 2 Residential 2015 (£690)

This amount will be used to support 6 pupils attending the Key Stage 2 Residential to the Horstead Centre, Norfolk in March 2015. Attendance increases pupils' self-confidence and enables pupils to access activities that they would not usually encounter, thereby enriching their experience.

Uniform (£100)

This amount has been used to provide uniform items (e.g. trousers, sweatshirts, dresses, shirts and PE Kit) for a number of eligible pupils. Ensuring that Ever 6 pupils are indistinguishable from their peers ensures that these pupils' self-esteem is maintained within the school environment.

Raising Boys Achievement Training Course (£250)

Attendance at this training course by all Classroom staff brought critical learning into this school centred on a group of eligible boys whose attainment had been a cause for concern. The knowledge gained by attendance has had a direct beneficial effect on the learning of this group of boys.

Pantomime 2014 (£495)

This amount has been used to support all 30 pupils attending the 2014 Christmas Pantomime Trip. Attendance enables pupils to access activities that they would not usually encounter, thereby enriching their experience.

Usage Summary – Pupil Premium Service Pupils

Creation of a small Group Working Area (£2,275)

This amount has been used to create Group Working areas for each class to enable all 12 pupils to participate in small Intervention Groups (max of 8 pupils per group at any time) with a TA to accelerate learning thereby 'narrowing the gap' with their peers. This area will also be used for a Nurture Group specifically for Service pupils, to encourage them to contact their deployed parent/carer and to express any concerns that they are feeling around their parents/carers absence.

Staffing for the above Intervention Groups and Nurture Group (£1,925)

Additional Teaching Assistant hours to ensure that the above Groups take place, accelerate pupils learning and maintain emotional stability.

Usage Summary – Pupil Premium Looked after Children

Key Stage 2 Residential 2015 (£115)

This amount will be used to support 1 pupil attending the Key Stage 2 Residential to the Horstead Centre, Norfolk in March 2015. Attendance increases pupils' self-confidence and enables pupils to access activities that they would not usually encounter, thereby enriching their experience.

Staffing for the above Intervention Groups and Nurture Group (£485)

Additional Teaching Assistant hours to ensure support to 1 pupil in Intervention Groups; to accelerate pupils learning and maintain emotional stability.
